Parish Letter

We seem to be in a season of opposites. On the one hand, there is the concern amongst many people about the forthcoming budget, about taxes of all kinds, prices going up and whether the outcomings will be more than the incomings – alongside the very real worry of some about whether they will be able to feed and clothe their children and keep a roof over their heads.

On the other hand, we are in a season of nature's abundance here in Cam Vale. We can see it everywhere and for those of us who have gardens or allotments, we have an abundance, certainly of apples and walnuts, and also other fruit, seeds and vegetables. So much so that apples left outside garden gates with invitations to 'help yourself' are not taken. The question that often haunts me is 'how can we get our abundance to those who could really do with it'?

It is most important that we value and respect what God gives us, not just in crops but in the second meaning of the word in the dictionary: 'overflowing fullness'. Jeff Foster in his book 'The Deeper Meaning of Abundance', describes it as: "the delight with which you savour each unique moment, the joy within with which you greet each new day. It is knowing yourself as presence, the power that creates and moves worlds. It is in your open heart, how deeply moved you are by love every day, your willingness to embrace, to hold what needs to be held".

Jesus said, 'I am come that they might have life and have it abundantly'. (John 10:10). And in Galatians 5:22-23, we read 'the fruit of the spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control'.

So, in this autumnal season, we can use nature's abundance as a hint to allow Jesus more fully into our lives that we might live in the abundance of spiritual life. How do we do this? One way could be to go slower in order to enjoy the 'unique moment' – to appreciate the beautiful colours of autumn and all the changes that come with it. Then perhaps to appreciate the changes that appear within our day – seeing them as opportunities to develop the fruits of the spirit, in particular, kindness and gentleness towards ourselves as we adjust to that change, and also exercising self-control, so that we do not see change as a problem.

We could try more to be generous by not judging others, rather accepting them as they are- for we know that is what Jesus would have done.

Joy is one gift that can be elusive in our everyday life. Try watching and listening to animals and allowing the joy they have to filtrate your being. Laugh when you hear birds carolling out for the sheer joy of singing: watch the bees dancing as they fly around to get pollen: experience the joy of horses kicking up their heels. And the chuckling of children delighting in simple things: taking time to enjoy the simple things for ourselves.

Above all, we could practise opening our hearts still more, so that we have love in abundance – not only for our friends and families but also to welcome and appreciate God's abundant love and live in his presence, if only for a few minutes now and then.

Well, that only leaves peace, patience and faithfulness to cultivate! Autumn has always been a time of new beginnings, so now is a good time to recommit to daily prayer for ourselves and for everyone. Then we will receive all of the gifts of the Spirit and live in abundance.
